



1.2) Why did you give the instructor this rating?

- Cost accounting can be tough for some students to stay interested. Professor Anand is very engaging which helps you stay focused and learn the material.

I had many "off line" questions for Professor Anand. He is the most responsive teacher I've had this whole two years. I'm incredibly appreciative of his effort outside of the classroom.

- Explains concepts clearly and uses real world examples. Allows students to arrive at the answers in their own time and in the own way. Critiques responses with respect and guides students to the right answers. Does not move ahead until everyone understands. Seems to really care that we are learning the content.
- He cares about being a good teacher and ensures students understand the material to do well
- He seems passionate about the topic and makes it fun and engaging as much as he can
- Instructor explained the concepts really well and was always ready to explain confusing concepts again.
- Professor Anand was extraordinarily diligent in providing every tool a student would need to learn the material, the relevance of the subject matter for motivating students to learn, and had the best organizational skills and follow up of any professor I've ever had. (ever) He made the classes enjoyable--thank you!
- Puts a lot of effort in making the material relevant and understandable to students.
- Really seems to care about student learning and keeping class time useful and engaging.
- Very knowledgeable and cares about students doing well. Explains the information clearly. Could be a little less PC and say students gave an incorrect answer at times.
- Well prepared, good examples and allowed critical thinking to develop.

1.4) Why did you give the course this rating?

- Course is very applicable to business professional.
- Even though the subject matter was dry, the Kahoots were fantastic--I wish all classes included them. The homework, however, seemed excessive at times and the MyLearningLab was very unintuitive. Particular pain points with the homework included free-form tables, where it was often unclear how the labels were intended, making the numbers also wrong. Flow-through errors in calculations were common for me because of the structure of some problems. I liked the cold calling in class and wish my peers had taken it more seriously.
- Felt like i learned it better in undergrad. This was super high level.
- Important concepts for business. Wish we had more time to cover budgeting.
- Much needed course for anyone going into business.
- Overall, it's useful content
- Solid, useful content even for folks who will never use it again. A bit slow in spots, but this is a function of trying to ensure retention so it works.
- Some of the homework was just repetitive and didn't stimulate learning.

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





1.4) Why did you give the course this rating?

- At certain points there was too much HW, but overall I learned a lot throughout the semester.

3. The things about this course or instructor that are most in need of improvement are:

3.1) Course:

- I would like to have seen more examples that were not focused on manufacturing
- It was too much outside work for me. And the amount of frustration and time I had to spend to understand had an out of balance cost-benefit ratio, but again, it did effectively teach the material. Perhaps alternating weeks where we do homework and cases, or lightening the homework if there are going to be 15 case questions. The combination of the two was so much some weeks.
- Less homework
- More homework to enforce concepts rather than equations.
- Reduce the amount of homework. It often took multiple hours to do online problems and the cases.
- There is too much homework.

3.2) Instructor:

- Assigns too much homework.
- I would reduce the amount of HW when a case is due.
